Academic Program

Using a semester schedule, MCC delivers a comprehensive college preparatory curriculum comprised of over 100 courses in 10 academic areas and includes 18 AP courses and 32 honors courses. Please note that scheduling constraints may impact the number of AP courses that a student can take.

Students must earn 28 credits to graduate, including the following requirements: Theology (4), English (4), Mathematics (4), Science (3), Social Studies (3), World Language (2), Physical Education (1), Fine/Practical Arts (1), and Electives. Students complete a minimum of seven credits yearly.

MCC does not rank students and is a 1:1 Chromebook school.
